President's Message

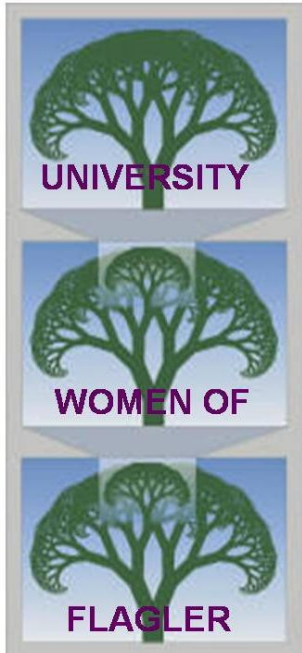

Program Carole Fiske introduced Troy Harper, Director of Emergency Management for Flagler County. He spoke about terrorism and Flagler Country. He explained domestic and foreign terrorists and said that even though we may think that there could not possibly be any reason for us to fear a terrorist attack, that it is necessary for us to be prepared for any possibilities. Because we have two major highways in the county that there is a possibility that a truck could be carrying explosives on these roads and have an accident that could cause devastation and we must be prepared. He explained that areas where there are a great many people gathered are prime examples of the possibility of a terrorist attack, such as schools and churches. The Emergency Management carried out a mock exercise in which they simulated the destruction of the Flagler Beach City Hall in which the officials were all killed. In this case he emphasized the importance to have back-up people to be able to continue government. Mr. Harper invited everyone to visit the Emergency Operations building.

The minutes of the previous meeting were approved as published and the treasurer's report was filed for audit.

Membership Laura Szczechowicz pointed out the display board of pictures and asked that if you have forgotten your name tag that you wear a label with your name written on it.
