# Scholarship News from the Committee

Late winter and early spring is the time of year when the UWF Scholarship Committee starts its annual winnowing of scholarship award applicants to determine who will be selected to participate in the interview process and ultimately be awarded the UWF scholarship dollars.

The process actually begins in the fall when UWF commits to providing a specific number of scholarships to be awarded through the Flagler County Education Foundation. In 2012, UWF gave three scholarships of \$1500 each to three graduating seniors from Flagler County. In 2013, UWF stepped up to offer not just the three \$1500 scholarships, but also to offer three \$500 scholarships to the same winners on completion of their freshman year - something to get them started as they entered their second year of university. The amount of the scholarship has increased over the years, along with the rising cost of college. In some years, UWF has awarded five \$3000 scholarships and six \$500 scholarships. What an achievement for UWF!

In 2023-24, UWF will be awarding six \$3000 scholarships - three raised through UWF fundraisers and three generously donated by UWF members - and three \$500 scholarships for returning students. Since the organization began in 2006, we have granted close to ninety scholarships for a total of over \$127,000 in scholarship awards.

#### **Eligibility**

A number of scholarships are granted to female high school seniors who have resided in Flagler County for at least a year and who plan to attend a four-year college in the next school year.

#### **The Application Process**

Applications are currently available online through a platform maintained by the Flagler County Education Foundation. Students apply online at their schools. Students are required to submit school transcripts (which include GPA, class rank, SAT and ACT scores, list of honors and Advanced Placement courses taken, Dual Enrollment classes at Daytona State, International Baccalaureate Program participation, honor society participation), two letters of recommendation, a list of volunteer and paid jobs and an essay of about 500 words explaining why they are applying for the scholarship and elaborating on their needs, their achievements and their goals.

#### **The Selection Process**

The Scholarship Committee (Sheila Walls, Pat Cotton, Trish LeNet, Pearl Jones, Lee Ross, Jeanne Nix) met on January 16, 2024 to refresh our understanding of the Flagler County Ed Foundation's website and the UWF rubric. Individually, we will work through the 34 candidates and come up with our top ten. Later in February, we will meet to come up with a common list of the top ten candidates that we can schedule for in-person interviews.

#### **Awards**

In May 2024, the Ed Foundation will host a celebratory barbecue for representatives of the organizations who have given scholarships - and there are quite a few of them! Around 4:30, representatives of the organizations will be driven to the students' homes where, surrounded by family and friends, the students will receive their scholarship award, along with the sign for their yard announcing their success. The whole neighborhood will be able to congratulate them. This also provides local recognition of the work that organizations like UWF are doing in our community! This year, the Ed Foundation has broken the scholarship presentations into two nights: May 7th for FPC and May 8th for MHS.

### Non-Traditional Scholarship News

Last year, UWF gave our Non-Traditional Student grant to the Family Life Center for help in the training/ education of one of the women in their shelter. The following is a report from them on how the funds were used:

"Dear Members of the University Women of Flagler,

First, let me begin by saying when we need, you have answered and we couldn't be more grateful for each and every one of you!

This year your grant assisted "Martha" with enrolling and completing her Certified Nursing Assistant program. This program has required prerequisite fees and activities which included, but were not limited to: completing a physical exam, ensuring all up-to-date immunizations; getting a TB and flu shot; completing CPR Basic Life Support for the Healthcare worker; drug screening; background check; purchasing CNA uniform requirements (i.e. specific shoes, scrubs and stethoscope); textbooks, workbooks, and lab fees.

Martha gained the foundational knowledge and skills to work as a CNA and any patient receiving her assistance would be well cared for. Martha is now engaged in a career and able to live independently and safely because of your generosity.

On behalf of Martha and all of us here at Family Life Center, thank you for being such a blessing! Together we save lives!


