## *November's Speaker, Lindsay Elliott of Habitat for Humanity*

We are pleased to have Lindsay Elliott, Executive Director of Habitat for Humanity in Bunnell, speak at our November 18th meeting.

Originally from Ontario, Canada, Lindsay came to Habitat for Humanity in 2001 through her internship from Stetson University, her senior year. During her internship, Lindsay was hired as the director of development for Habitat for Humanity of Greater Orlando. Lindsay then moved to be the first staff person at Habitat for Humanity of Greater Apopka and was with that affiliate for 2.5 years, till 2005 when she and her now husband took the opportunity to backpack around the world for 9 months through Africa, India, SE Asia and China.

After the trip ended mid-2006, Lindsay applied for the position of Executive Director here at Flagler Habitat for Humanity and has been with them for the past 17.5 years!

In the past 17 years, Lindsay has helped to create new homeownership opportunities for 90 families who otherwise would not have the chance to own a home, initiated Neighborhood Revitalization in South Bunnell and many more programs to directly serve our low and very low-income communities.

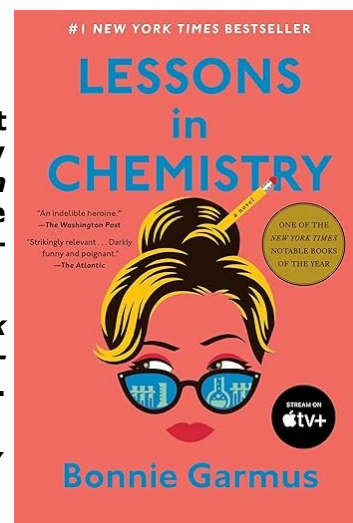

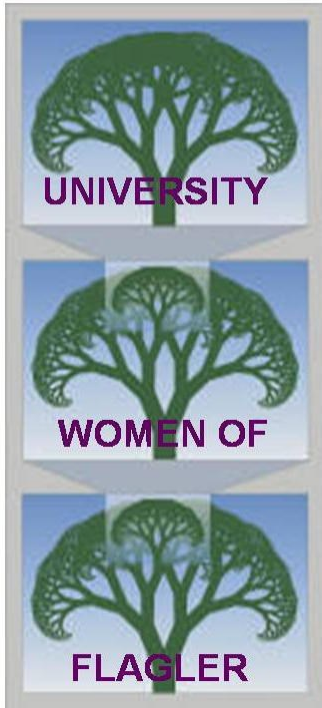
