

February 15, 2020 Minutes from the General Meeting at the Hilton Garden Inn

The meeting was called to order at 9:20 AM by Co-President Pat Cotton.

Rhenda Brodnax presented the inspirational message.

Trish LeNet, co-chair of membership, reported that the organization now has 87 members. If anyone is in need of a name badge, she is the one to see; if someone needs a picture for the directory, Jane Mealy is the contact.

The updated Treasurer's report is in *The Wave*. It was moved and accepted to file for audit.

The minutes of the January 18th meeting can also be read in *The Wave*. They were moved and accepted by the members present.

Susan Moya, chair of Programs, described the upcoming visit to Flagler College. On April 7th student guides will conduct a tour of the campus, and a buffet lunch will be served in its historic ballroom. The tour is limited to 60 participants and the cost is \$30.

Susan then introduced Meshella Woods, Curator and Board Director of the African American Cultural Society. Ms. Woods' presentation included the history, mission, activities, outreach, and perceived future of the AACCS.

New Business

Trish LeNet requested volunteers for the Nominating Committee. The sole position open for the upcoming year is Recording Secretary. Kay Forest has agreed to become one of the two secretaries needed. Thus far the committee includes Linda Jaeger, Donna Daly Boggs, Joan Riley, Trish LeNet and Suzanne Timko. The new slate will be announced in March, voted upon in April, and installed in May.

Holly Flynn announced a tour of the two local high schools open to UWF members. The Flagler Palm Coast High School tour will occur on Thursday, March 5th, from 9:30 AM to 11:30 AM. The Matanzas High School tour is scheduled for Wednesday, April 22 from 10:00 AM to 11:30 AM. Members have only to arrive at the schools at the scheduled time to participate. \$10 will be collected at the beginning of each tour (\$5 for the UWF scholarship fund; \$5 for Classroom to Careers program).

Donna Daly Boggs reported that the recently formed travel group had met and decided on four tours in the next few months that our members might be interested in taking:

The Scholarship Process

It is that time of year when the UWF scholarship committee makes its annual selection of recipients. There have been many questions raised by UWF members about the process, so I shall try to explain it here.

Eligibility

A number of scholarships are granted to female high school seniors who have resided in Flagler County for at least a year and who plan to attend a four-year college in the next school year.

The application process

Applications are currently available online through a platform maintained by the Flagler County Education Foundation. Students apply online at their schools. Students are required to submit school transcripts (which include GPA, class rank, SAT and ACT scores, list of honors and Advanced Placement courses taken, Dual Enrollment classes at Daytona State, International Baccalaureate Program participation, honor society participation), three letters of recommendation, a list of volunteer and paid jobs, FAFSA (federal government assessment of need) score and a statement explaining why they are applying for the scholarship.

The Selection Process

The committee meets with a representative from the Flagler County Education Foundation who gives them electronic access to completed applications. Each committee member uses a scoring sheet to assess points for each application. The highest scoring applicants (no more than 10) are then interviewed by the committee at their respective schools. The committee then selects recipients for the available scholarships and gives that information to the Flagler County Education Foundation.

Awards

Recipients only learn of the scholarship grant at the Flagler Schools Honors Award night in late April. Each group granting scholarships announces the names of the recipients and gives students a certificate. They also request information about the student's college choice. The scholarship award is sent to the recipient's college financial office. UWF recipients are also given information about the UWF scholarship luncheon in May. Recipients are required to attend the luncheon and meet our members. First year scholarship recipients may reapply for a \$500 scholarship the following year.

I have been a member of this committee since 2014. When I began, applications were submitted on paper by the school guidance counselor and each committee member had to read and evaluate as many as 40 completed applications. Once taken over by the Flagler County Education Foundation, the application process moved to an electronic platform. Now committee members read the applications at the same time on a large computer screen. The number of UWF scholarships granted depends on the amount of money our group has raised the previous year. We also accept scholarship donations from UWF members and members of the community. Since the organization began in 2006, we have granted over eighty scholarships for a total of over \$117,000 in scholarship awards.



Underestimated in everything else, she overheard the Third Reich's plans while at her husband's side, understanding more than anyone would guess. She devised a plan to flee in disguise from their castle, and the whirlwind escape landed her in Hollywood. She became Hedy Lamarr, screen star.

But she kept a secret more shocking than her heritage or her marriage: she was a scientist. And she knew a few secrets about the enemy. She had an idea that might help the country fight the Nazis...if anyone would listen to her.



Spinach/Artichoke Balls from Joanne Mason

Lunch Bunch on Friday, February 14th was at the home of Joanne Mason and the requested recipe was for:

Spinach Artichoke Balls(No photo - they ate them too fast! LOL)

Ingredients:


- 16 ounce package of frozen, chopped spinach (thaw & drain well)
- 8 ounce package of frozen artichokes - chopped fine
- 4 eggs
- 1 onion - chopped fine
- 1/2 cup shredded mozzarella cheese
- 1 cup shredded Parmesan cheese
- 2 cloves garlic - minced
- 2 cups Italian Bread crumbs
- 4 tablespoons melted and cooled butter

Steps:

- 1 - Preheat oven to 350
- 2 - Squeeze excess water from drained spinach and place in large bowl
- 3 - Add remaining ingredients & mix by hand
- 4 - Form into 1- 1/2 inch balls and roll in plain breadcrumbs (to give added crispness)
- 5 - Place on parchment lined baking sheet
- 6 - Bake 20 - 25 minutes until firm
