

# *Minutes from the March 20, 2021 General Meeting*

President Linda Jaeger called the meeting to order at 9:31AM.

Karen Flaherty showed a video of Current Women in History. The video included female heads of state and leaders of countries all over the world, including women in leadership roles in the United States.

Linda Jaeger asked for approval of the February General Meeting Minutes. Jane Mealy made the motion, seconded by Kay Forest. The minutes were unanimously approved.

Linda Jaeger then asked for approval of the January Actual/February Preliminary Treasurer's Report as it appeared in the March Wave. Treasurer's report was approved unanimously on a motion by Jane Mealy, seconded by Suzanne Timko.

## **Membership**

Trish LeNet reported that we had acquired three new members for a total membership of 90. Trish welcomed one new member, Betty Bonnick, present at the meeting. Trish also reminded members to send their \$50 membership renewal to Donna Daly-Boggs. Members who joined as of January 2021 do not have to renew.

## **Treasurer's Report**

Rosemary Zattiero, Assistant Treasurer, reported that our current operating account balance was \$10,467.13 and that our scholarship account balance was \$29,573.66.

Linda Jaeger mentioned that UWF would be giving 2 scholarships this year, giving money to Take Stock in Children, the Dolly Parton Imagination Library, and the Family Life Center.

## **Programs – Susan Moya**

Susan introduced our speaker, Judge Andrea Totten, Flagler County Judge. Judge Totten congratulated UWF for our great work in the county. She works with probate, guardianship, civil and criminal cases in the county. She came to the county in 2019. She explained how Covid has affected the judicial system. The county (especially the clerk's office) has facilitated court proceedings using the Zoom technology. The use of this technology has put Flagler County far ahead of other Florida counties.

Judge Totten took questions from the group and also gave us her previous experiences and how she came to be a Flagler County Judge.

Our April speaker will be Joseph Joyner of Flagler College. He will be discussing the programs they are holding with communities in our area.

## **Elections/Nominating Committee – Linda Hagman**

Linda recognized and thanked her committee members for their hard work. The slate is as follows:

We do not yet have a person to fill the Treasurer's position. Linda addressed the group and asked for any possible candidates to contact the board. It is planned to present the slate in the April Wave and vote on them at our April General Meeting.


### **The Dutch House**

Throughout their lives they return to the well-worn story of what they've lost with humor and rage. But when at last they're forced to confront the people who left them behind, the relationship between an indulged brother and his ever-protective sister is finally tested.

There is a covered pavilion with four tables affording ocean views and other comfort facilities next to the parking lot and walkover to the beach.


