

Also, the **May Scholarship Luncheon** on Saturday, May 11th has been changed to a breakfast at 9:30am. Please note the change on your calendar.



Our April General Meeting Speaker: Joel Fallon of Granny Nannies

Joel Fallon was born in Point Pleasant, New Jersey, and moved to Hollwood, Florida where he lived most of his life. He met his wife, Lynn, in college and they have been married for 32 years. Lynn and Joel have four children and four grandchildren.

Joel received his Bachelor of Science degree with a minor in accounting at Pensacola Christian College.

His career began in the hotel industry until one day his grandmother needed assistance with everyday living. The agency he hired to take care of his grandmother was charging what he thought was too much, and the services were not adequate for what she needed for her health and wellness care.



At that time, he decided to start his own senior care company. So, in 2001 with one caregiver and a small office, Granny Nannies began. Today, 22 years later, he has over 135 caregivers caring for the needs of the elderly in both Flagler and St. John's counties.

Joel has several hobbies - one was flying until he crashed his airplane and miraculously survived. Now he is flying a flight simulator in his office and helping others become entrepreneurs with his advice and talents.

He is a member of the Rotary club of Flagler County, the Tiger Bay Club, BNI and is on multiple boards here in Flagler County serving our community.

Hour of the Witch




