April General Meeting Program: "Flagler County Beach Erosion and Replenishment"

Ansley Wren-Key, Ph.D., is the Coastal Engineering Administrator for Flagler County. Since starting with the County in 2022, she has helped to implement over 15 miles of dune and beach restoration along the County's coastline. She has also been instrumental in the development of a sustainable Beach Management Program for restoring the County's beaches, which have seen accelerated erosion rates over the last decade.

Prior to joining the County, she worked as an Assistant Professor in the Marine Science Department at Coastal Carolina University, where she taught classes on Coastal Processes and developed a research program investigating the impacts of beach nourishment on nearshore habitats. She received her Doctorate degree from North Carolina State University, and her B.S. in Civil Engineering from University of South Carolina.

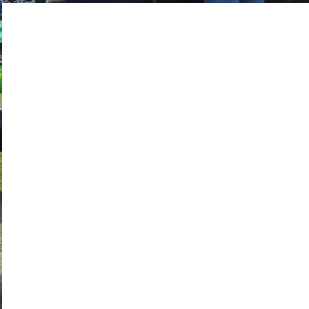

Scholarship Committee Update 2025

This is scholarship season for our high school seniors and University Women of Flagler (UWF) plays an important role. The Flagler County Education Foundation (FCEF) is working with more than 50 local businesses and organizations in 2025 to help ease the minds of our graduating seniors by awarding 175 scholarships to colleges and trade schools totaling over \$450,000. This year students were required to submit their applications for scholarships by January 20.

The UWF Scholarship Committee is co-chaired by Pat Malak and Dale Curran with members Pat Cotton, Pearl Jones and Jo Dervan. We held our first meeting on January 28 to review our scholarship requirements and process. UWF scholarships are given to high school girls who are planning to attend a four-year college or university. We then individually reviewed the 31 applications for our scholarships on the FCEF secure site using the UWF Rating Sheet.

We met again on February 4th to discuss our ratings and to narrow down the applicants to the ten girls with the highest scores to interview. There were so many great applicants that it was hard to pick just ten, but our scoring was very consistent so reaching agreement on the ones to put forward for interviews was easy. The applicants that we selected are very well-rounded young women with impressive academic achievements including honors, advanced placement, international baccalaureate, Cambridge and Dual enrollment classes and high SAT and ACT scores. They also were very involved in many activities in school and the community. On March 11th, we spent the morning at Matanzas High School interviewing the students from that school and went to Flagler County Palm Coast High School in the afternoon for interviews and submitted our choices. The awards will be announced in May – first as we inform each student at their home, and then at the May UWF Scholarship Luncheon.

The recipients will each receive \$3000 that is paid directly to their chosen school. They are also eligible to apply for a second scholarship of \$500 after completing their freshman year. UWF holds multiple events every year to raise money for the scholarships. This year our fundraisers included two separate Days of Games, a Murder Mystery Dinner, and Jersey Mike's Day. In addition, two UWF members, Jo Dervan and Lee Ross, each contributed funds for a full memorial scholarship.

The 2020-2021 school year was still not quite back to normal, and FCEF was not able to have an in-person award ceremony due to COVID-19 restrictions. So, over 150 Flagler Schools staff members and community members came together to fan out across Flagler County in 30 teams for the 2021 Senior Scholarship "Drive & Surprise" event to visit the recipients at their homes. It was such an amazing effort that "made every recipient feel like a sweepstake winner" that FCEF has continued the practice. This year they are sponsoring a BBQ and Surprise for MHS scholarship recipients on May 7 and for FPCHS recipients on May 8. Several of our Committee Members and our Co-Presidents plan to participate.

The Committee has also requested and received applications for a second-year scholarship from the six students who received a UWF scholarship last year. All of the 2025 recipients have been invited to attend UWF's May 17th meeting. Being involved in this process is very rewarding for the committee members in addition to the students.

UWF Non-Traditional Grant Committee Report

The Non-Traditional Student Grant committee interviewed the staff at several agencies in Flagler County that deal with mature women in need of education to help them improve their job opportunities. Members of the committee are Kay Forest (chair), Pat Smith, Jeanne Seavey, Phyllis Erno, Holly Flynn, and Janice Nickol. The purpose of the committee is to grant funds for the education, training, intellectual development, individual growth and job opportunities for non-traditional women students.

To facilitate the awarding of the grants to appropriate students, the following nonprofit organizations were chosen to receive our grant funds—the Family Life Center, the Flagler Technical Institute and the Alpha Women's Center. In past years, UWF grants have funded women for CNA programs, massage therapy, CPR courses, drug screening, background checks, uniforms, textbooks, certification, testing and lab fees, cosmetology, notary and other licenses. The grants have provided the women with the ability to earn a living to live independently and support their families.

Funds for the grants come from the UWF scholarship account plus several members earmarked donations for this purpose. Thank you, committee, for your hard work and UWF members for your generosity. It is gratifying to see the impact that our organization has had on our community.

ARTICLE VII – OFFICERS

Section 2: Duties

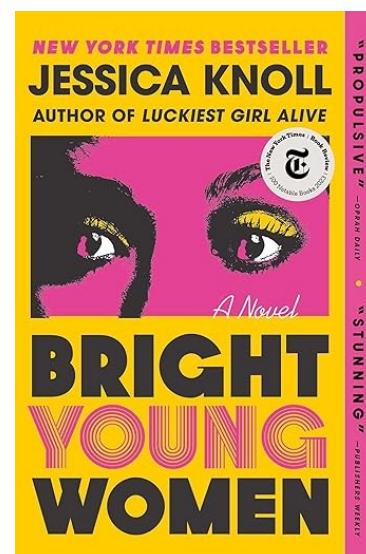
