
From the Presidents



Section 4: Tenure:

All officers shall take office on July 1. All officers, except President-Elect, shall serve for a term of two years or until their successors are elected and assume office. They shall

be eligible for re-election to the same office for one term only, **with the exception of the Treasurer**. The incoming or continuing President may call a meeting of the Board of Directors or the Executive Committee prior to July 1 for the purpose of approving appointments and making plans for the coming year.

Section 7: Elections:

Voting shall be by ballot, unless there is only one candidate for office, when it may be by voice. A majority of votes cast shall be necessary for election, except when there are three or more candidates for an office, a plurality shall elect. Elections shall be held at the April meeting of the organization **beginning in 2007**.

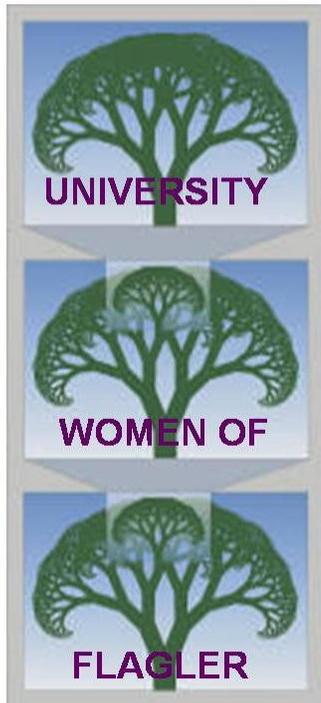
