

### October Guest Speaker:

### Randy Jaye, author of *Perseverance*

#### White Author Randy Jaye Will Share His Findings on How Blacks Have Had to “PERSEVERE” as They Helped Shape Today’s Flagler County and Rural South

Question for you -- Did you know that Moody Boulevard (Route 100) and Herschel King Park were named in honor of leading Ku Klux Klan members here in Flagler County? Or that Isaac I. Moody is attributed as being the “Father of Flagler County” and a KKK clan is *named* for him?

**Randy Jaye, our October 17 General Meeting speaker and author of *Perseverance***, will discuss this and many more heretofore unknown facts about what blacks endured, particularly in Flagler County and elsewhere in the rural South, during the decades of slavery, under Jim Crow racial segregation laws, dealing with segregation in the military, being excluded by “redlining” and the G.I. Bill, and throughout the Civil Rights movement right up to today.

While only 2,450 to 4,500 people lived in the county from the 1910s up to the 1970s, *our county has had a very interesting history*. Here are some of the points he’ll discuss with us:

- ◆ The role black slaves and free blacks played in the development of our county and rural South.
- ◆ Our founders’/leaders’ significant ties to the KKK, and later to the pervasively influential white supremacist “Citizen Council” whose members included Commissioners, a tax collector, chaplains, sheriffs and school officials.

- ◆ The famous “Christmas Letter” to Flagler’s Colored Voters – a community wide physical threat to prevent blacks from voting.
- ◆ No high school provided for blacks for 32 years, and the fact that the Flagler County school board filed one of the last and most frivolous lawsuits to prevent desegregation, finally becoming integrated nearly 18 years after *Brown v. Board of Education*.

Mr. Jaye’s book is both historical and timely. The UWF Bookminders read *Perseverance* for its September meeting and recommends it to both Flagler County students and adults.



## Let's Add Alice!

The Florida Women's Hall of Fame was created by Florida Statute in 1982 to honor women who, through their lives and efforts, made significant contributions to the improvement of life for women and all Florida citizens. They are pioneers who have broken down barriers, created new opportunities, and championed issues to better Florida and its people. These women are immortalized on an honorary wall in the halls of the Florida Capitol. Wouldn't it be wonderful to have a Flagler County woman as part of Florida's Women's Hall of Fame, especially in this year that marks the anniversary of the 19<sup>th</sup> Amendment which finally gave women the right to vote? The Flagler Branch of AAUW has nominated just such a woman - Alice Scott Abbott - for 2020 and is asking for UWF's support.

Alice Scott Abbott taught music at the historic First United Methodist and the Seventh Day Adventist Churches in Bunnell. She delivered the first lecture on votes for women at an 1893 state convention held in St. Augustine. Ms. Alice formed one of the most loyal Women's Christian Temperance Unions (WCTU) at the First United Methodist Church. (Many of the suffragists were also in favor of Prohibition). As a delegate at large at the 1913 WCTU convention, she carried the national message of change - secure the vote to protect wages for women and girls, end the legal sale of liquor, enforce moral laws, and stop the trafficking of women and girls - to Grace M.E. Church in St. Augustine.

Within a year, Alice Scott Abbott was appointed as superintendent of this district and traveled more the 17,000 miles to advance suffrage for women.

Once the 19<sup>th</sup> Amendment was ratified, Mrs. Abbott's efforts resulted in voter registration and education for nearly 200 Flagler County women, 52 of whom were African American. She truly enjoyed these efforts; however, unfortunately, her health failed and she died just days before the Nov. 2, 1920 election.

The Florida Commission on the Status of Women has stated that Ms. Abbott is one of ten finalists from whom the Governor can select three women to induct into the Hall in 2020. # *Lunch Bunch recipe: Chicken Cacciatore*

*From the kitchen of Edda Steinmeier*

## Chicken Cacciatore

### Ingredients

2 cups flour for coating	2 (14.5 oz) cans diced tomatoes
½ teaspoon salt	3 tablespoons tomato paste
¼ teaspoon ground black pepper	½ cup white wine
6 chicken thighs	2 cups sliced mushrooms
2 tablespoons vegetable oil	salt and pepper to taste
1 onion, chopped	
2 cloves of garlic, minced	
½ cup celery, chopped	
1 green bell pepper, chopped	
1 teaspoon dried oregano	

### Directions

#### Step 1

Debone chicken, but save bones for added flavor while cooking. Combine the flour, salt and pepper in a plastic bag. Shake the chicken pieces in flour until coated. Heat oil in large pot with lid. Fry chicken thighs including bones until browned on all sides. Remove from pan.


#### Step 2

Add onion, garlic, celery and bell pepper to pot and sauté until onion is slightly brown. Add chicken pieces and top with tomatoes, tomato paste, oregano and wine. Cover and simmer for about 30 minutes over medium heat.

#### Step 3

Add the mushrooms and salt and pepper to taste. Simmer for 10 more minutes. Remove from heat. Serve over pasta or rice.
