From the President


Hello UWF,

October 14, 2017 General Membership Meeting

The meeting, held at the Hilton Garden Inn, was called to order by Barbara Holley at 9:00am. Rhenda Brodnax gave an inspirational talk about the need to make compromises.

Membership-

Barbara Holley welcomed a guest, Kara Smith. She also presented a new member, Yvonne Jukes, who told us about herself.

It was noted that replacement pages for the UWF Directory are available for anyone who has not yet received them.

Program-

Leila Hardison introduced John Birney, Jr and Nancy Walsh. Mr. Birney is the chairman of the Flagler Imagination Library group and Ms. Walsh is the director of the Early Learning Coalition of Flagler and Volusia. They explained that the Imagination Library was founded by Dolly Parton in 1995. The goal of the Imagination Library is to inspire a love of reading in young children. To achieve that goal, enrolled children are sent a free book every month from birth to age 5. The Dollywood Foundation provides a book ordering system and a fulfillment system to get the books to recipients.

The Flagler County Dolly Parton Imagination Library, began in 2010 and supported by the Young Professionals Group of Flagler County, provides the funding for the books. Currently there are 1,400 Flagler County families enrolled in the program. The cost of purchasing and mailing the books is approximately \$30.00 per child annually.

Mr. Birney also told of how studies have shown that those children who are exposed to books at an early age and have books at home, have an educational advantage when they start Kindergarten.

***Ceremony* by Leslie Marmon Silko**


The great Native American Novel of a battered veteran returning home to heal his mind and spirit

More than thirty-five years since its original publication, *Ceremony* remains one of the most profound and moving works of Native American literature, a novel that is itself a ceremony of healing. Tayo, a World War II veteran of mixed ancestry, returns to the Laguna Pueblo Reservation. He is deeply scarred by his experience as a prisoner of the Japanese and further wounded by the rejection he encounters from his people. Only by immersing himself in the Indian past can he begin to regain the peace that was taken from him. Masterfully written, filled with the somber majesty of Pueblo myth, *Ceremony* is a work of enduring power.

The magnificent Pulitzer Prize-winning novel of a stranger in his native land



But the other world -- modern, industrial America -- pulls at Abel, demanding his loyalty, claiming his soul, goading him into a destructive, compulsive cycle of dissipation and disgust. And the young man, torn in two, descends into hell.



The Flagler Dolly Parton Imagination Library

At the October UWF General Meeting, John Birney Jr and Nancy Walsh spoke about the Flagler Dolly Parton Imagination Library. There are approximately 1400 children in the county under the age of 5 years old who receive an age appropriate book each month from this organization. The goal of the organization is to improve early literacy in our community.

The cost to the local group is approximately \$30 per child per year. The Dollywood Foundation covers program overheads by providing the book ordering system and coordinating the book selection, procurement and fulfillment process. The local group conducts fundraisers and seeks partners in the community.

Lunch Bunch October Recipe

So-Addicted Chicken Enchiladas

From: *The Skinnytaste Cookbook*

1 teaspoon canola or olive oil	Cooking spray or oil mister
1 cup chopped onion	8 (7- or 8-inch) low-carb, whole wheat flour tortillas
2 large garlic cloves, minced	1½ cups Best Enchilada Sauce from Scratch (recipe follows) or store-bought sauce
½ cup canned tomato sauce	1 cup shredded reduced-fat Mexican cheese blend (such as Sargento)
⅓ cup reduced-sodium chicken broth	2 Tablespoons chopped scallions, for garnish
9 ounces cooked, shredded chicken breast	4 Tablespoons light sour cream, for serving (optional)
¼ cup plus 1 Tablespoon chopped fresh cilantro	
1 teaspoon McCormick Mexican-style chili powder	
1 teaspoon ground cumin	
½ teaspoon dried oregano	
¾ teaspoon kosher salt	

Preheat the oven to 400°F.

In a medium nonstick skillet, heat the oil over low heat. Add the onion and garlic and cook, stirring, until soft, about 2 minutes. Add the tomato sauce, chicken broth, cooked chicken, ¼ cup of the cilantro, the chili powder, cumin, oregano, and salt. Simmer until the flavors blend and the sauce reduces, 4 to 5 minutes. Remove the pan from the heat.

Spray a 13 ×9-inch glass baking dish with oil. Put ⅓ cup chicken mixture into each tortilla, roll them up, and place seam side down in the baking dish. Top with the enchilada sauce, then sprinkle the top with the cheese. Cover the dish with foil, being careful it does not touch the cheese. Bake until hot and the cheese is melted, 20 to 25 minutes.



To serve, put an enchilada on each of 8 serving plates, sprinkle with the scallions and the remaining 1 Tablespoon cilantro, and serve with light sour cream on the side, if desired.

Perfect Pairings:

Serve these with cilantro lime rice. Combine ¾ cup cooked brown rice with a squeeze of lime juice and a Tablespoon chopped fresh cilantro. Add a simple side salad.

Lunch Bunch October Recipe

Best Enchilada Sauce from Scratch

½ teaspoon olive oil	1 teaspoon McCormick Mexican-style chili powder
4 garlic cloves, minced	(or more to taste)
1½ cups Swanson 33% less sodium chicken broth	1 teaspoon ground cumin
3 cups canned tomato sauce	½ teaspoon kosher salt
2 Tablespoons chopped chipotle chile in adobo sauce (or more to taste)	⅛ teaspoon freshly ground black pepper


Heat medium nonstick saucepan over medium heat. Add the oil and garlic and cook, stirring, until golden, about 1 to 1½ minutes. Add the chicken broth, tomato sauce, chipotle chile, chili powder, cumin, salt, and black pepper. Bring to a boil, reduce the heat to low, and simmer until the flavors blend, 7 to 10 minutes. Serve immediately, or let cool and refrigerate in an airtight container for up to 3 days, or keep frozen for up to 3 months.
