Dear UWF Members,


Welcome Members, and happy fall.



## November's Book Selection



**#1 NEW YORK TIMES BESTSELLER • Pulitzer Prize–winning author Jon Meacham helps us understand the present moment in American politics and life by looking back at critical times in our history when hope overcame division and fear.**

Our current climate of partisan fury is not new, and in *The Soul of America* Meacham shows us how what Abraham Lincoln called the “better angels of our nature” have repeatedly won the day. Painting surprising portraits of Lincoln and other presidents, including Ulysses S. Grant, Theodore Roosevelt, Woodrow Wilson, Franklin D. Roosevelt, Harry S. Truman, Dwight Eisenhower, and Lyndon B. Johnson, and illuminating the courage of such influential citizen activists as Martin Luther King, Jr., early suffragettes Alice Paul and Carrie Chapman Catt, civil rights pioneers Rosa Parks and John Lewis, First Lady Eleanor Roosevelt, and Army-McCarthy hearings lawyer Joseph N. Welch, Meacham brings vividly to life turning points in American history. He writes about the Civil War, Reconstruction, and the birth of the Lost

Cause; the backlash against immigrants in the First World War and the resurgence of the Ku Klux Klan in the 1920s; the fight for women’s rights; the demagoguery of Huey Long and Father Coughlin and the isolationist work of America First in the years before World War II; the anti-Communist witch-hunts led by Senator Joseph McCarthy; and Lyndon Johnson’s crusade against Jim Crow. Each of these dramatic hours in our national life have been shaped by the contest to lead the country to look forward rather than back, to assert hope over fear — a struggle that continues even now.

While the American story has not always—or even often—been heroic, we have been sustained by a belief in progress even in the gloomiest of times. In this inspiring book, Meacham reassures us, “The good news is that we have come through such darkness before”—as, time and again, Lincoln’s better angels have found a way to prevail.





## Recipes from Lunch Bunch

Thanks to Edda Steinmeier for hosting the October Lunch Bunch and providing these recipes

### White Cheddar and Cranberry Dip

#### INGREDIENTS

2 cups Extra-Sharp White Cheddar cheese, shredded (2 Tbsp. reserved)  
8 oz. cream cheese, at room temperature  
1/4 cup cranberry sauce (recipe below)  
1/2 cup fresh cranberries  
French Baguette  
Olive Oil



#### CRANBERRY SAUCE – YIELDS ABOUT 2 CUPS

1 (12 oz.) bag fresh cranberries, rinsed  
1 cup + 2 Tbsp. granulated sugar  
3 Tbsp. orange juice  
1 Tbsp. lemon juice  
1/4 cup water

#### INSTRUCTIONS

- Preheat the oven to 375F.
- In a bowl, mix together the cheddar cheese and cream cheese. Fold in the cranberry sauce and fresh cranberries. Lightly coat an oven-safe baking dish with non-stick spray and add the dip. Bake on a baking sheet on the middle rack for 18-23 minutes or until heated through and bubbly.
- While the dip is baking, slice the baguette on a diagonal and arrange the slices in a single layer on a baking sheet. Brush tops of slices with olive oil.
- After the dip is done baking, switch the oven to broil. Sprinkle the reserved cheddar on top of the dip; broil the dip and the prepared baguette slices for 1-2 minutes or until lightly brown and toasted. (Keep an eye on both as they burn easily).

#### CRANBERRY SAUCE

- Add all the ingredients to a medium saucepan.
- Cook over medium-low heat, partially covered, stirring occasionally, until the sugar dissolves and the cranberries burst, about 15-20 minutes.

### Pecan Pie Cheesecake

Pecan Pie Cheesecake Dessert Recipe (*modified from [OMG Chocolate Desserts](#)*)

#### Ingredients

##### For the Crust:

1 and 3/4 cups **Nilla Wafers** cookie crumbs  
1/4 cup light brown sugar  
1/3 cup unsalted butter (melted)

##### For the Pecan Filling:

1 and 1/4 cup light brown sugar  
2/3 cup dark corn syrup  
1/3 cup unsalted butter (melted)  
2 large eggs (lightly beaten)  
1 and 3/4 cups pecans (chopped)  
2 teaspoons vanilla extract



**For the Cheesecake Filling:**

3 8 ounce packages (24 ounces total) cream cheese (softened to room temperature)  
1 and 1/4 cups light brown sugar  
2 tablespoons all-purpose flour  
4 large eggs  
2/3 cup heavy cream  
2 teaspoons vanilla extract

**For the Topping:**

3 and 1/2 tablespoons unsalted butter (melted)  
1/2 Cup light brown sugar  
1 teaspoon ground cinnamon  
1/4 cup heavy whipping cream  
1 cup toasted pecans (chopped)

**Instructions****To Toast the chopped pecans:**

- Preheat oven to 350°F.
- Lightly spritz **baking sheet** with **cooking spray**.
- Spread the chopped pecans evenly on the oil spritzed **baking sheet** and toast them just until they become aromatic, about 5 minutes. (You have to watch them carefully as they are easily scorched.)

**To make the Crust:**

- MAKE SURE you are looking at the ingredient measurements in the section just for the crust!
- Line the bottom of **9 inch springform pan** with **parchment paper** and set aside.
- Combine Nilla wafer cookie crumbs and brown sugar, stir in melted butter, then press the mixture evenly into bottom and halfway up the side of your **9 inch springform pan**. Set aside in the refrigerator to firm up the crust while you make the filling.

**To make the Pecan Filling:**


- MAKE SURE you are looking at the ingredient measurements in the section just for the PECAN filling layer!
- In a **medium saucepan**, combine light brown sugar, corn syrup, melted butter, eggs, toasted pecans and vanilla. Bring to a boil over medium-high heat, stirring constantly. Reduce heat and simmer stirring constantly until thickened (about 5-7 minutes). Pour into your prepared crust and set aside.

**To make the Cheesecake Filing:**

- MAKE SURE you are looking at the ingredient measurements in the section just for the CHEESE-CAKE layer!
- Preheat the oven to 350°F.
- Beat the cream cheese until creamy, then add brown sugar and flour and beat until fluffy.
- Add eggs, one at a time, beating just until combined after each addition. \*\*\*Be VERY careful to not overbeat it. Stir in the heavy cream and vanilla, then pour cheesecake mixture over your pecan filling.
- Place **springform pan** on a **baking sheet**, put it in the oven and reduce the heat to 325°F. Bake the cheesecake for 60-70 minutes (until a toothpick inserted in the center comes out almost clean). \***"To check if your cheesecake is done, gently shake the cheesecake. If the cheesecake looks nearly set and only a small circle in the center jiggles slightly, it is done. (The center will firm up during the cooling time.) Do not use a knife to check doneness."** – BHG\* Turn off your oven and leave the cheesecake in your with oven door closed for 1 hour. (Set a timer!)
- Run a knife around edges of cheesecake but don't take out of the **springform pan** until completely cooled.

**To make the topping:**

- MAKE SURE you are looking at the ingredient measurements in the section just for the TOPPING!
- In a **small saucepan** combine butter and brown sugar. Cook for 3-5 min or until very bubbly, then stir in cinnamon, heavy whipping cream and chopped, toasted pecans. Cool to room temperature.
- Release the sides of **springform pan** and spoon the topping over cooled cheesecake.
