

Beth McKeirnan was raised in Catonsville, Maryland a suburb of Baltimore. She moved to Florida to attend Southeastern Academy. After school, Ms. McKiernan spent 20 years at Sentinel Communications as an advertising manager and in the early 2000's moved to the digital world managing teams across the country selling human resources software as a solution for the next 18 years. Beth started as a volunteer with the Guardian ad Litem Program in 2018 and decided to do a 180 on her career and get involved with child welfare as her sunset career. She was hired as their Volunteer Recruiter in 2019 while still maintaining her volunteer base. As the Volunteer Recruiter, she is responsible for recruiting new volunteers into the 7th Circuit, Volusia, Flagler, St. Johns and Putnam Counties. In addition to recruiting, she is responsible for circuit training and development and PR. If there is a place that she can spread the word about the Guardian ad Litem Program, she will be there!

Answers to last month's questions from Nicki Junkins

In a follow-up letter to Phyllis Erno and Pearl Jones after her UWF presentation on October 9th, Nicki Junkins of the LWV, responded: "Here are the 2 questions I could not answer this morning:

Did SB 90 make any changes to what partisan observers are allowed to do at the polling locations during early voting or on Election Day? SB 90 allows partisan parties to inspect mail ballots, envelopes, and ballot cure affidavits with corresponding comparison signatures, as well as duplicate and original ballots. It allows the voter certificate and cure affidavit to be used as the basis to protest or challenge a vote before and during the canvassing board process, not at the polling locations for early voting or on Election Day.

Did SB90 include any language about auditing election results? The short answer is no. The bill does allow partisan observers to protest or challenge a vote before and during the canvassing process as stated in the question above."




